

The idea of DevOps as you see here was not that your job was in the middle there, but that each team could work together to deliver better customer outcomes via automation and collaboration.


DevOps History

I want to go farther back to the 90s when IT really began forming. The heady days of giant budgets CDW was all too happy to help spend.




A lot of the times, even those outside of the DevOps cycle can feel a little alone.
