### Sass Mixins vs Extends: The Data

March 9, 2015

The debate between using mixins or extends in Sass has been heating up recently. From the surface it appears they both provide solid benefits in helping us write consistent and modular code. However, the critics are out and extends specifically have come under fire. But why?

(If you're unsure what mixins and extends are, or the Sass preprocessor, I'd recommend researching them before before continuing here.)

### The Argument

There are a handful of arguments against extends, the most popular include:

- Extends don't allow arguments
- Extends don't work within media queries
- Extends, when nested, can extend unintended code
- Extends group the compiled CSS based on reused declarations, not on how the code is contextually written













### How to be an open source gardener

I do a lot of work on open source, but my most valuable contributions haven't been code. Writing a patch is the easiest part of open source. The truly hard stuff is all of the rest: bug trackers, mailing lists, documentation, and other management tasks. Here's some things I've learned along the way.

It was RailsConf 2012. I sat in on a panel discussion, and the number of issues open on rails/rails came up. There were about 800 issues at the time, and had been for a while. Inquiring minds wished to know if that number was ever going to drop, and how the community could help. It was brought

### CSS AND SCALABILITY

Several years ago I got curious about how css worked at scale. When I first started out, there weren't nearly as many learning resources as there are now. There were a few books that my friends lent me and a couple of decent blog posts. But CSS was still pretty new and most people hadn't started to think deeply or learn hard lessons about concepts of maintainability when working with teams on large web apps.



### Large Scale CSS Refactoring at trivago

Project Ironman: the technical migration of the trivago hotel search's existing CSS core

The article was originally posted on the trivago techblog.

While our company and our application were constantly growing, we often ran into some consistency issues between code and design. Because we didn't have a design/frontend system and development guidelines to follow, our UI became cluttered and unsustainable. This caused maintenance issues, slowed down our UI Development and caused us to produce technical debt with an overcomplicated CSS/DOM structure. In the end, we were afraid of spending our time on figuring out crazy rendering bugs rather than rapidly developing new UI features. I gave a <u>lightning talk</u> at the beginning of 2015 to present what we had learned at the <u>LeanUX Meetup</u> in Düsseldorf.
